




Accomplishments


- Updated New Council Meeting Procedures which has resulted in more productive meetings



Review and Revise Zoning Code

- Urban Dwellings, Mixed Use Developments in the Central Business District Article 11A no limit on density
- Controlled growth -What type of development is desirable

- Short Term Rentals motivation for rezonings and deannexation requests need to establish policy
- Policies to attract workforce housing

Vision Topics – Looking Forward

Develop 5 Year Capital Improvement Document to Address Infrastructure Needs – Reinvest in Residential Areas

- Evaluate the city's roads and sidewalks to develop a plan to resurface roads and replace sidewalks.
- Include water and sewer improvement projects
- Include needed drainage improvements
- Review Downtown Park, City facilities and Mineral Springs Trails to determine needed improvements.
- Address equipment and vehicle needs and include a replacement schedule.
- The implementation of technology improvements and management information systems to enhance the productivity and efficiency of City operations.
- Need to develop funding sources from impact fees, stormwater utility fees, grants and developer improvements.



Government Structure

The most effective form of government is based on the premise that the responsibility for policy rests with the City Council and the responsibility for daily administration and execution of policy rests with the City Administration. In order to be successful, a team-like atmosphere between the City Council and Administration must be developed. The structure is similar to a private corporation as it emphasizes that the government operates as a business.
